Older people make huge contributions to society through volunteer work, transmitting experience and knowledge, helping their families with caring responsibilities, and participating in the paid labour force.


- The theme for International Day for Older Persons this year is "Digital Equity for All Ages" affirms the need for access and meaningful participation in the digital world by older persons.

#### - Mahatma Gandhi








### WORLD ANIMAL WELFARE DAY – 4 OCTOBER 2021



The walls of the school building were also decorated with informative charts and instructive posters to inspire students to accept and adopt the language in their daily conversations with the best will in the world.









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




#### GANGA UTSAV: A RIVER FESTIVAL – 1 NOVEMBER – 3 NOVERMBER 2021







#### **WORLD TSUNAMI DAY - 5 NOVERMBER 2021**

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
#### **CONSTITUTION DAY - 26 NOVERMBER 2021**


#### **INDIAN NAVY DAY – 4 DECEMBER 2021**

Navy Day in India is observed every year on December 4 to celebrate its achievements and envision its role in safeguarding the Naval Territory of our country. The theme of Indian Navy Day 2021 is 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh' signifying 50 years of India's victory in the Indo-Pakistan war that took place in 1971. Activities like Poster making, Speech, Collage making and Power point presentations were conducted for students of classes VI - XII to celebrate the true essence of the day.










The Indian Navy is the <u>naval branch</u> of the <u>Indian Armed Forces</u>. The <u>President of India</u> is the Supreme Commander of the Indian Navy. The <u>Chief of Naval Staff</u>, a <u>four-star admiral</u>, commands the navy. As a <u>blue-water navy</u>, it operates significantly in <u>Persian Gulf Region</u> and the <u>Horn of Africa</u> to the <u>Strait of Malacca</u>, and routinely conducts anti-piracy operations

routinely conducts anti-piracy operations and partner with other navies in the region. It also conducts routine two to three month-long deployments in them in the South and <u>East China</u> seas as well as the western Mediterranean sea simultaneously.



- The Chief of the Naval Staff is the commander and the highest-ranking officer in the Indian Navy. The position is abbreviated CNS in Indian Navy cables and communication, and usually held by a four-star officer in the rank of Admiral.
- The current CNS is Admiral Sunil Lanba. The 23rd Navy Chief, he took over from Admiral Robin K. Dhowan, who retired on 31 May 2016 after four decades of service from the navy.

The Indian Navy is one of the largest navies in the world, and as of 2017 possesses 1 aircraft carrier, 1 amphibious transport dock, 8 Landing ship tanks, 11 destroyers, 14 frigates, 1 nuclear-powered attack submarine, 1 Ballistic missile submarine, 13 conventionally-powered attack submarines, 23 corvettes, 6 mine countermeasure vessels, 10 large offshore patrol vessels, 4 fleet tankers and various auxiliary vessels and small patrol boats. For ships no longer in service see List of ships of the Indian Navy and for future acquisitions of the fleet, see future ships of the Indian Navy.






#### NATIONAL MATHEMATICS DAY – 22 DECEMBER 2021




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








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


### GOOD GOVERNANCE DAY – 25 DECEMBER 2021



The programme pairs different states and Union Territories to enhance unity and integrity among the people of India. Our state Haryana is paired with the southern state Telangana for the purpose.
