In 2002, the Second World Assembly on aging adopted the Madrid International Plan of Action on aging, to respond to the opportunities and challenges of population aging in the 21st century and to promote the development of a society for all ages.

GANDHI JAYANTI – 2 OCTOBER 2021

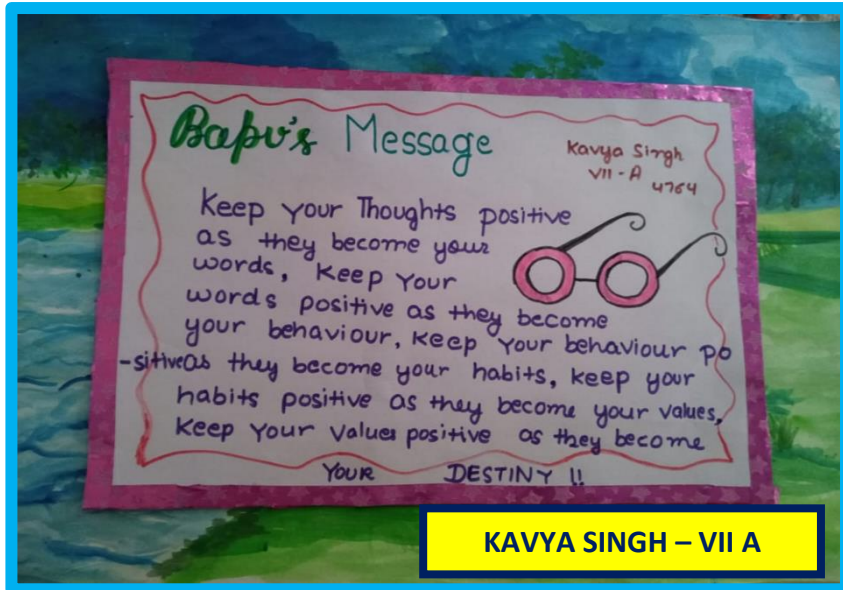

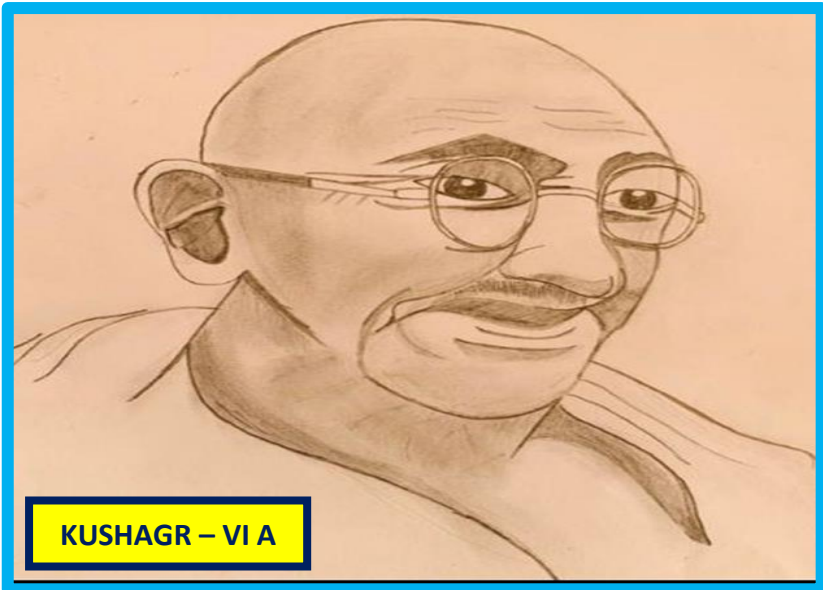
Gandhi Jayanti is celebrated on October 2 every year to mark the birth anniversary of the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi, leader of the Indian Independence Movement and pioneer of the philosophy and strategy of non-violence.

This day reaffirms "the universal relevance of the principle of non-violence" and the desire "to secure a culture of peace, tolerance and understanding".

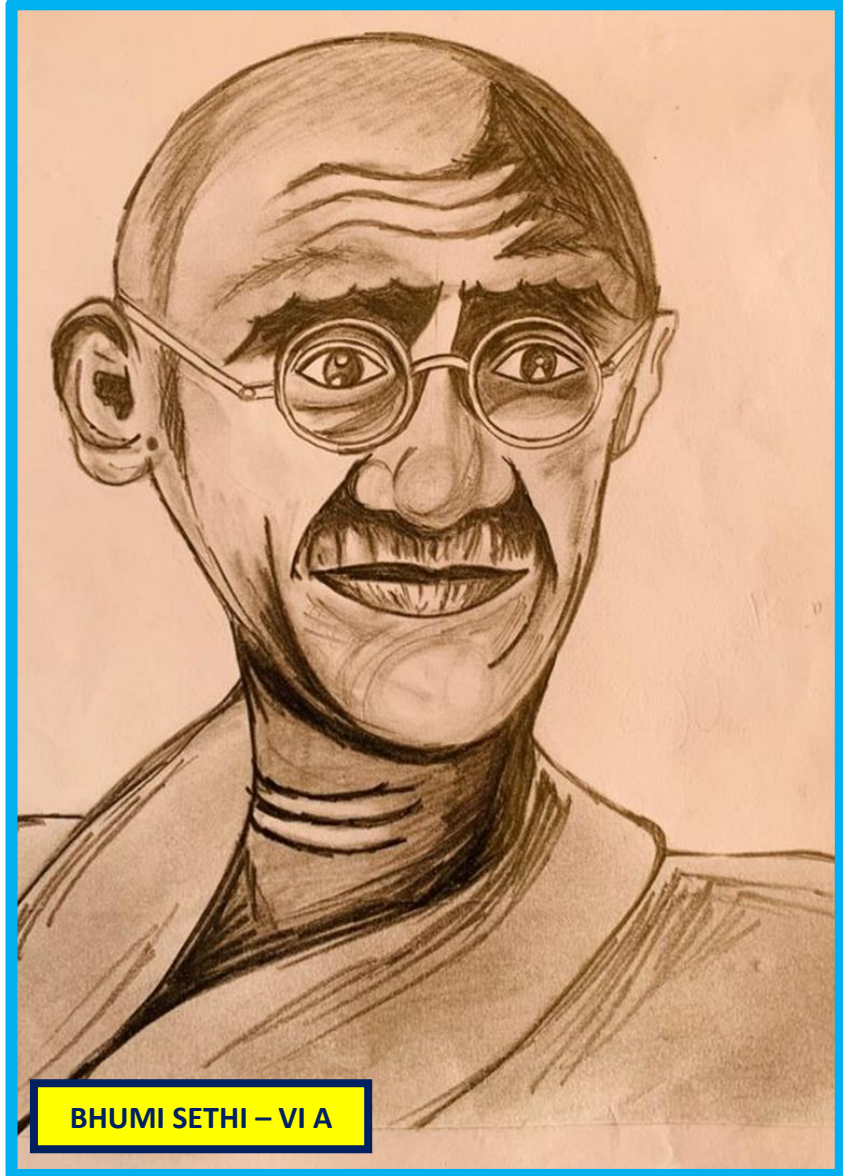
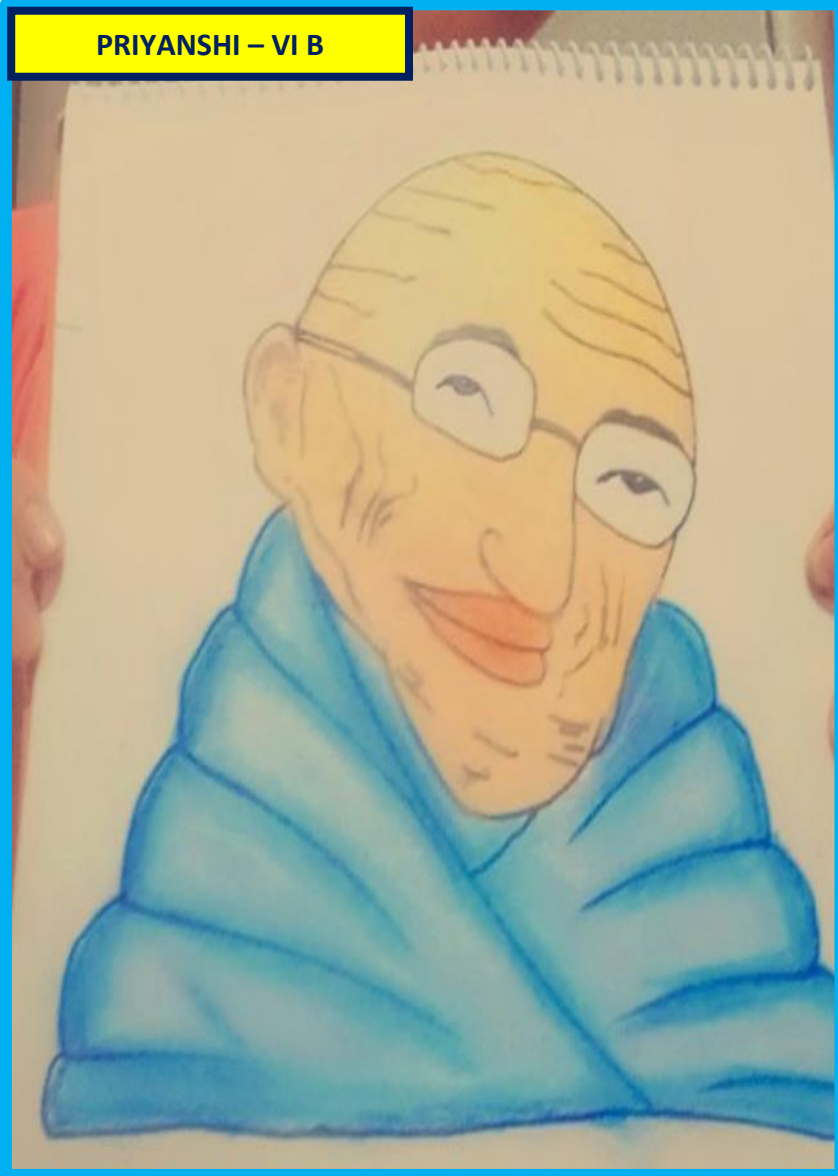

Gandhi ji's Philosophy of Nonviolence

'I object to violence because when it appears to do good, the good is only temporary; the evil it does is permanent.'
- Mahatma Gandhi.



Ahimsa (Nonviolence) and satyagraha (peaceful civil disobedience) has been the part of Indian religious tradition for centuries. It was Gandhi's genius that transformed what had been an individual ethic, into a tool of social and political action. Gandhi's great achievement was to create and practice a non-violent method to free India from British. Gandhi believed that, for non-violence to be strong and effective, it must begin with the mind of and without which it will be nonviolence of the weak and cowardly.

Gandhi took the religious principle of ahimsa (doing no harm) common to Buddhism, Hinduism and Jainism and turned it into a non-violent tool for mass action. He used it to fight not only colonial rule but social evils such as racial discrimination and untouchability as well.

Gandhi ji believed on utopian socialism. He believed that socialism is not against the riches, rather, it practised nonviolence. The purpose is to educate the rich, to teach them moral values. Gandhi ji's Trusteeship

Principle was based on this ideology that the rich, the factory owners and land owners won't have give up their wealth. Instead they'll be taught that the wealth that is more than what is needed for their survival, they are only the trustees of that extra wealth. And who will be the owner of that extra wealth?

- Gopal (Hindu's God).

He said that all belongs to god.

Gandhi was inspired by the Isha Upanishad's (A Hindu scripture) Apari Grah, the principle of non-possesion. He said that if one accumulates so much wealth, it will be akin to stealing (a theft). Famous industrialists CRD Tata, Azim Premji the biggest philanthropist in India were inspired by Gandhi's Trusteeship Principle.

In Gandhi's ideas of India, his ideas symbolized in propaganda, stated that India is a nation capable of economic self-sufficiency (Self-sufficient Bharat) without the British, a unity transcending religion would make for a stronger nation and that the most effective method of protest was through passive resistance, including nonviolence and Peace.

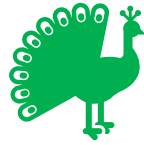

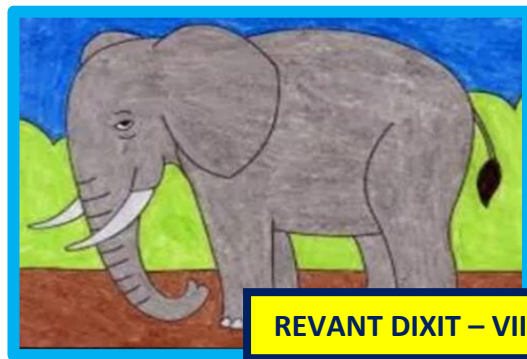


WORLD ANIMAL WELFARE DAY – 4 OCTOBER 2021

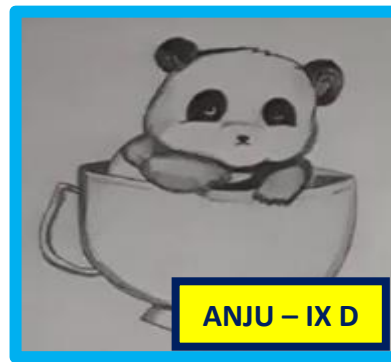

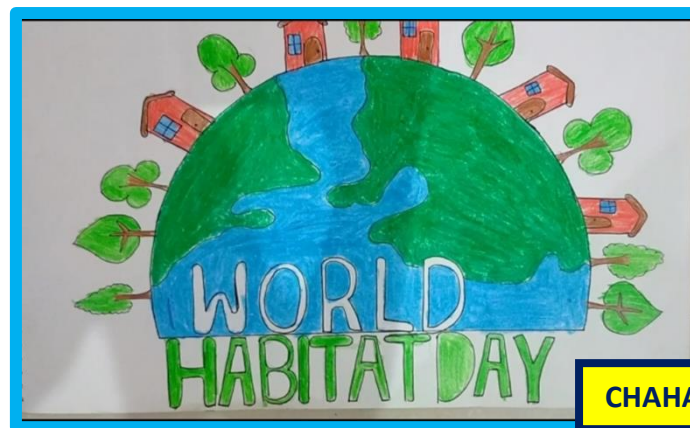
WORLD HABITAT DAY – 7 OCTOBER 2021

The walls of the school building were also decorated with informative charts and instructive posters to inspire students to accept and adopt the language in their daily conversations with the best will in the world.

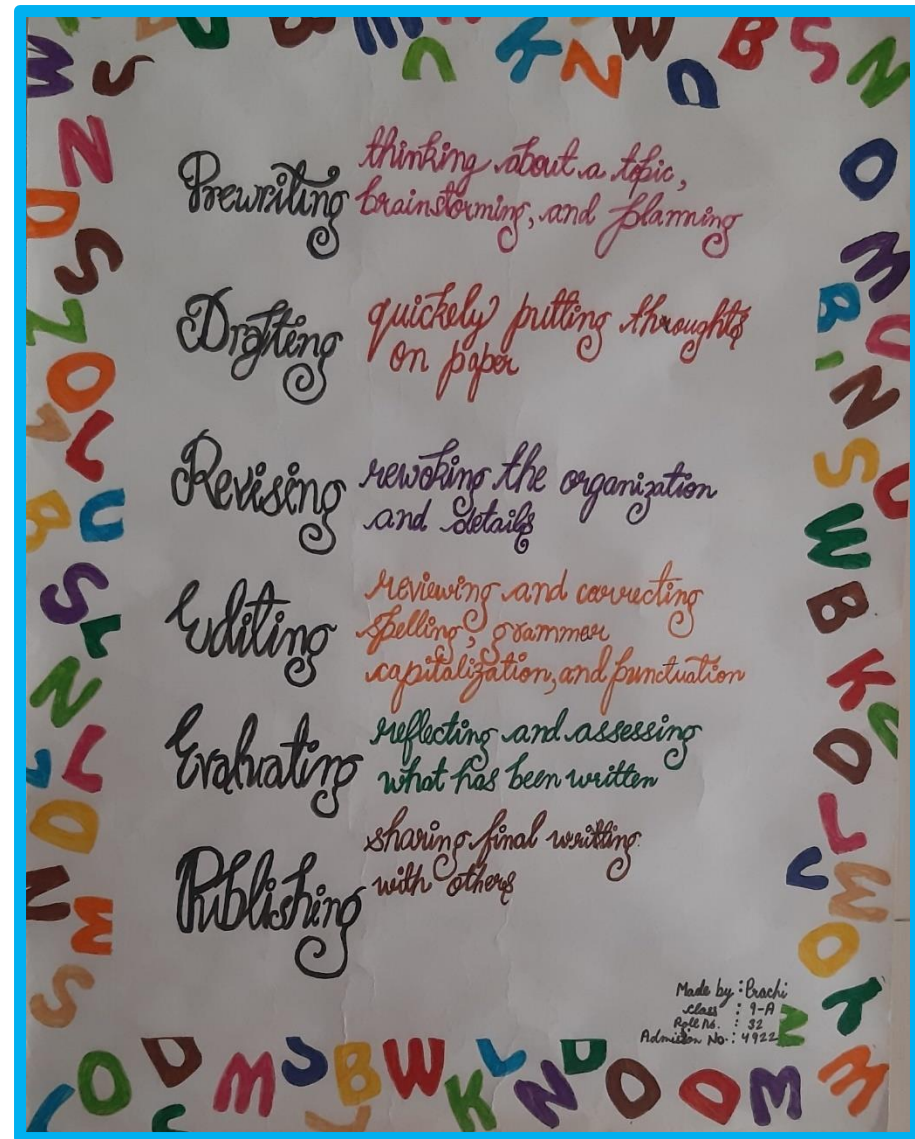

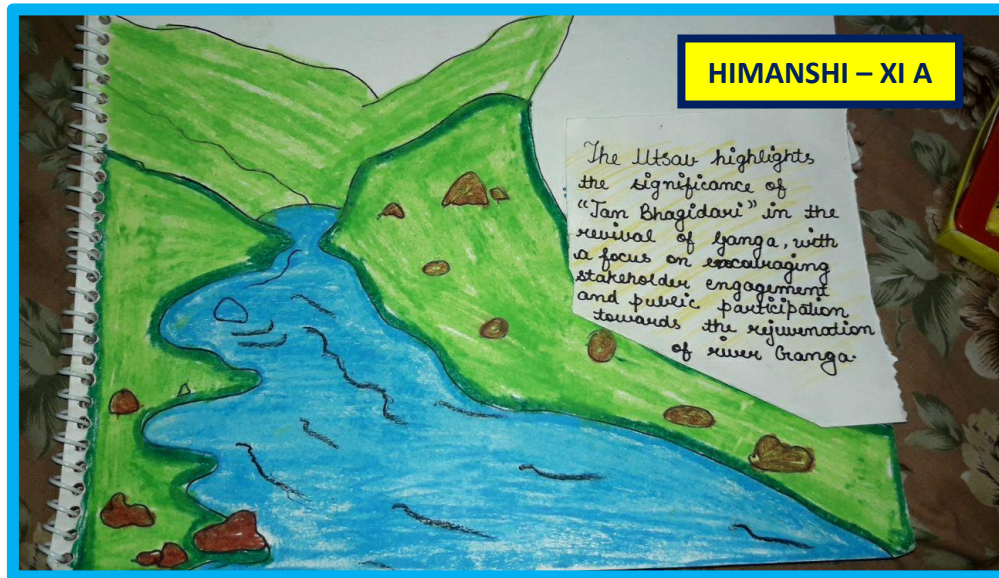
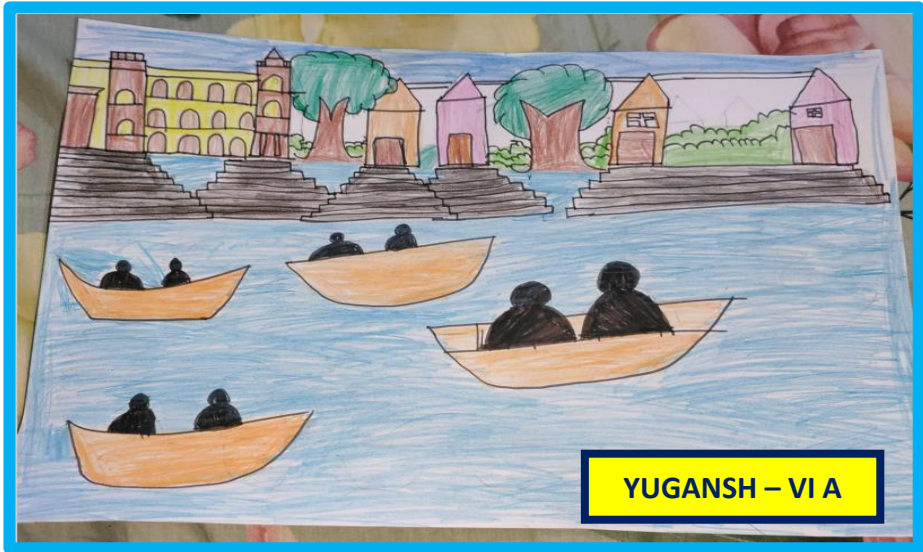
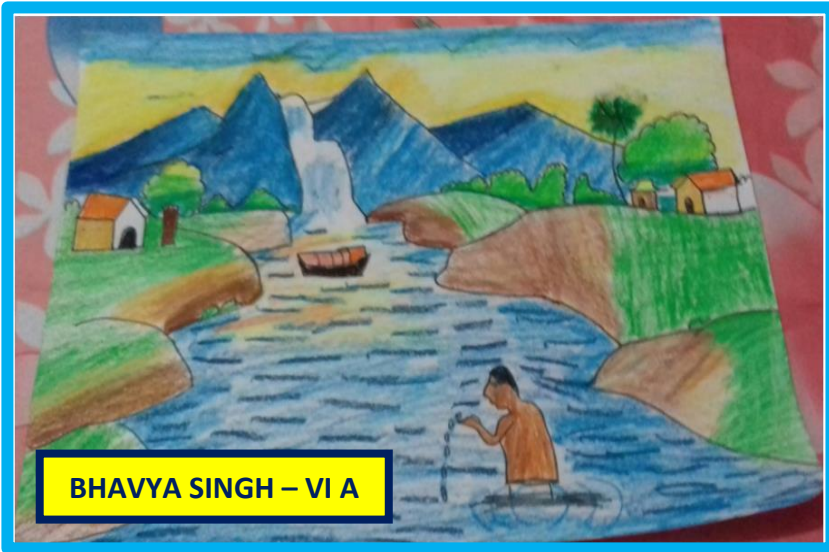
GANGA UTSAV: A RIVER FESTIVAL – 1 NOVEMBER – 3 NOVEMBER 2021

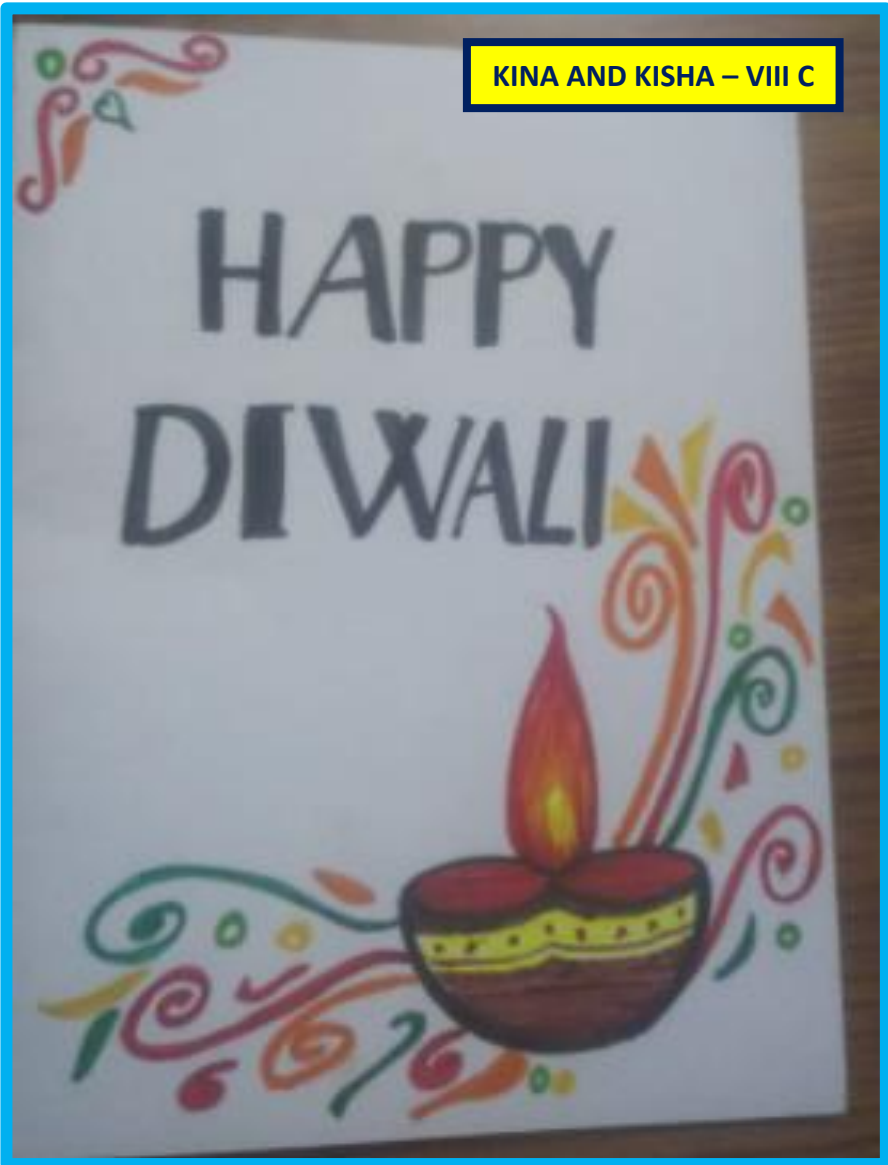

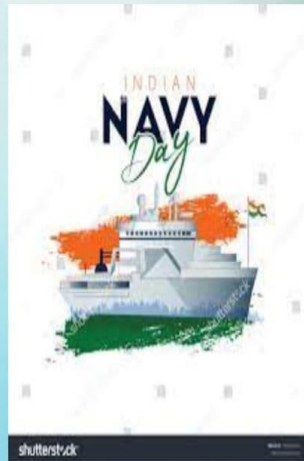

Navy Day in India is observed every year on December 4 to celebrate its achievements and envision its role in safeguarding the Naval Territory of our country. The theme of Indian Navy Day 2021 is 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh' signifying 50 years of India's victory in the Indo-Pakistan war that took place in 1971. Activities like Poster making, Speech, Collage making and Power point presentations were conducted for students of classes VI - XII to celebrate the true essence of the day.

Navy Day in [India](#) is celebrated on 4 December every year to recognize the achievements and role of the [Indian Navy](#) to the country. 4 December was chosen as on that day in 1971, during [Operation Trident](#), the Indian Navy sank four Pakistani vessels including [PNS Khaibar](#), killing hundreds of [Pakistani Navy](#) personnel. On this day, those killed in the [Indo-Pakistan War of 1971](#) are also remembered.



Navy week celebration

Various events take place during Navy Week with the finale on Navy Day. On this day the warships and aircraft of the Indian Navy are open to visitors such as school children. The Military Photo Exhibition is also performed by photojournalists of the Ernakulum in the Navy fest. Other events such as blood donation camps are also held. A community service for the Indian Navy is conducted by the Naval Institute of Aeronautical Technology (NIAT) at Good Hope Old Age Home, Fort Kochi in which the students from the Navy Children School Chair take turns to entertain the inmates and Naval doctors (from INHS Sanjivani) provides medical checkup to the inmates. The Navy Ball and Navy Queen contests including the Navy fest are held to celebrate Navy Day. Year 2020 celebrations will take the viewers to a 360 degree Virtual Reality Tour of the INS Vikramaditya, commissioned on 16 November 2013.



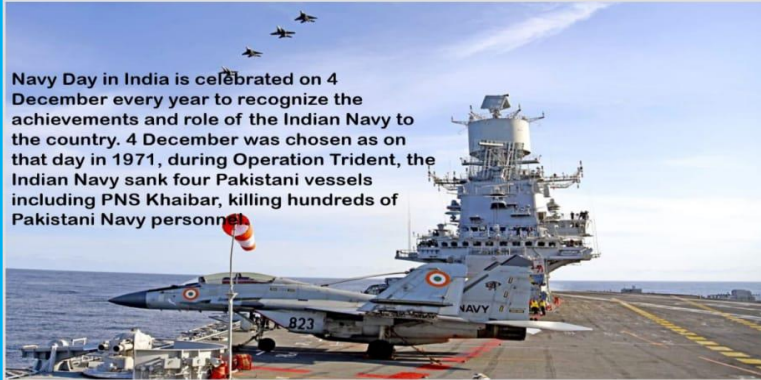

The Indian Navy is the naval branch of the Indian Armed Forces. The President of India is the Supreme Commander of the Indian Navy. The Chief of Naval Staff, a four-star admiral, commands the navy. As a blue-water navy, it operates significantly in Persian Gulf Region and the Horn of Africa to the Strait of Malacca, and routinely conducts anti-piracy operations and partner with other navies in the region. It also conducts routine two to three month-long deployments in them in the South and East China seas as well as the western Mediterranean sea simultaneously.

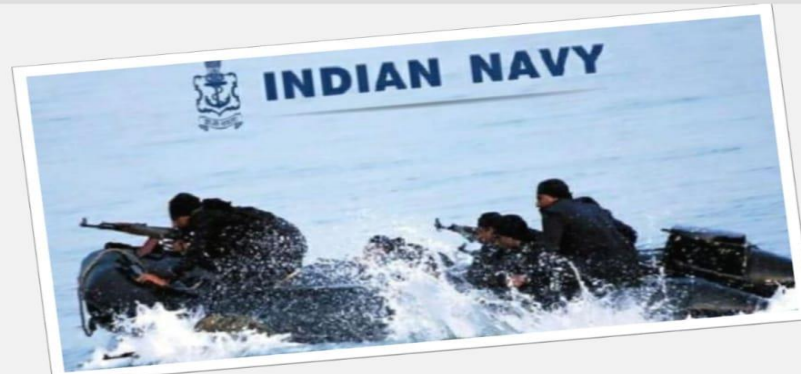

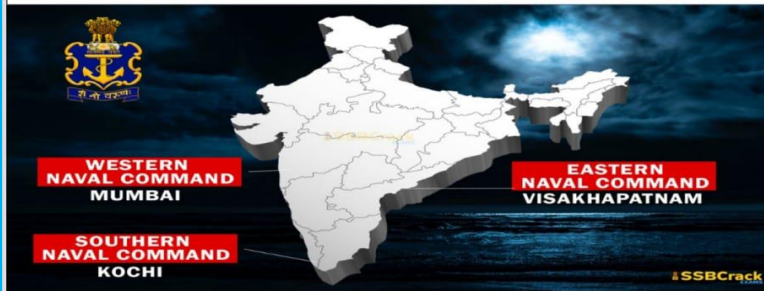




CHIEF OF NAVAL STAFF

- The Chief of the Naval Staff is the commander and the highest-ranking officer in the Indian Navy. The position is abbreviated CNS in Indian Navy cables and communication, and usually held by a four-star officer in the rank of Admiral.
- The current CNS is Admiral Sunil Lanba. The 23rd Navy Chief, he took over from Admiral Robin K. Dhowan, who retired on 31 May 2016 after four decades of service from the navy.

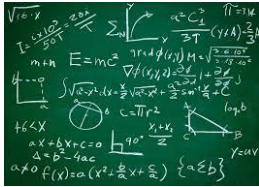

- List of active Indian Navy ships is a list of ships in active service with the Indian Navy. In service ships are taken from the official Indian Navy website. The Indian Navy is one of the largest navies in the world, and as of 2017 possesses 1 aircraft carrier, 1 amphibious transport dock, 8 Landing ship tanks, 11 destroyers, 14 frigates, 1 nuclear-powered attack submarine, 1 Ballistic missile submarine, 13 conventionally-powered attack submarines, 23 corvettes, 6 mine countermeasure vessels, 10 large offshore patrol vessels, 4 fleet tankers and various auxiliary vessels and small patrol boats. For ships no longer in service see List of ships of the Indian Navy and for future acquisitions of the fleet, see future ships of the Indian Navy.

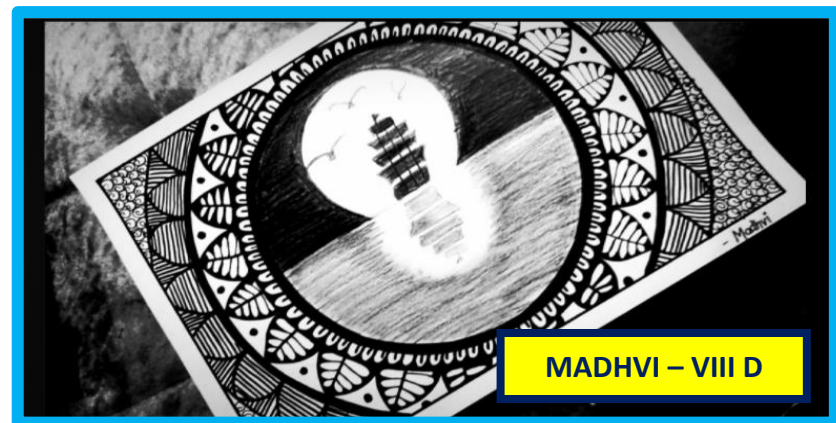




NATIONAL MATHEMATICS DAY – 22 DECEMBER 2021

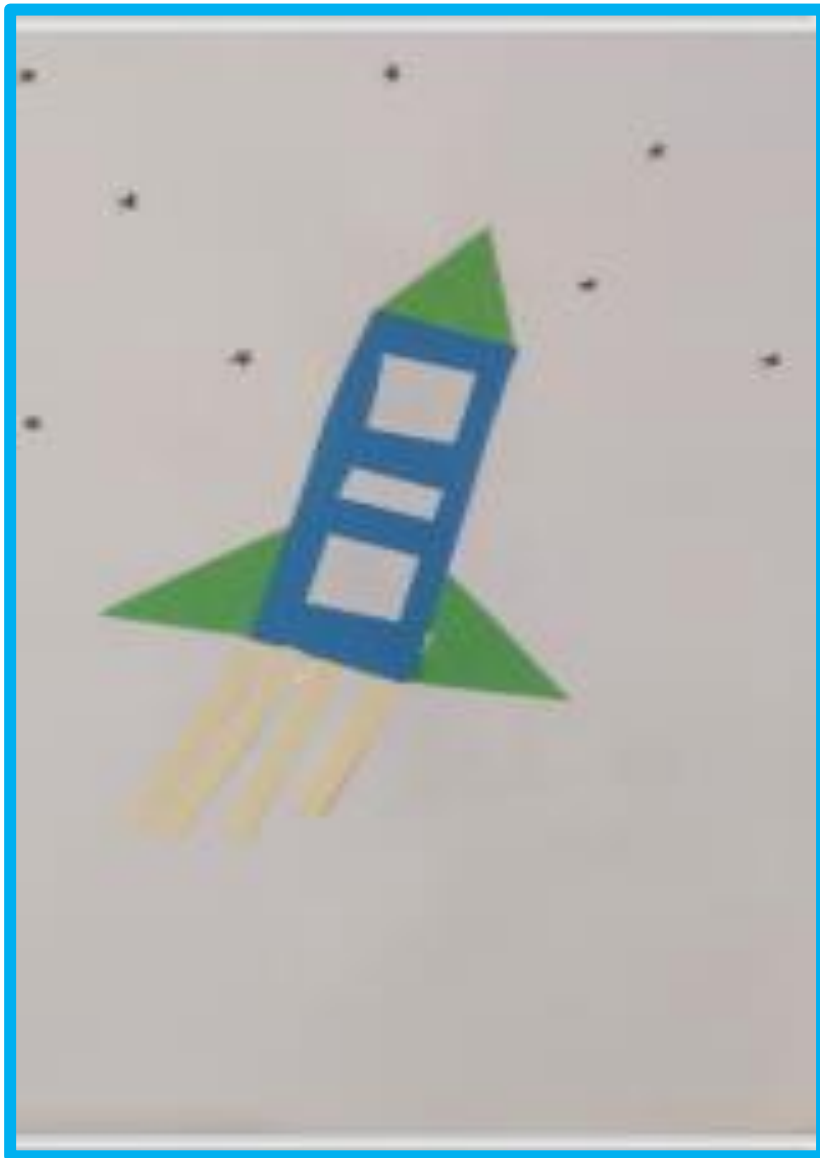


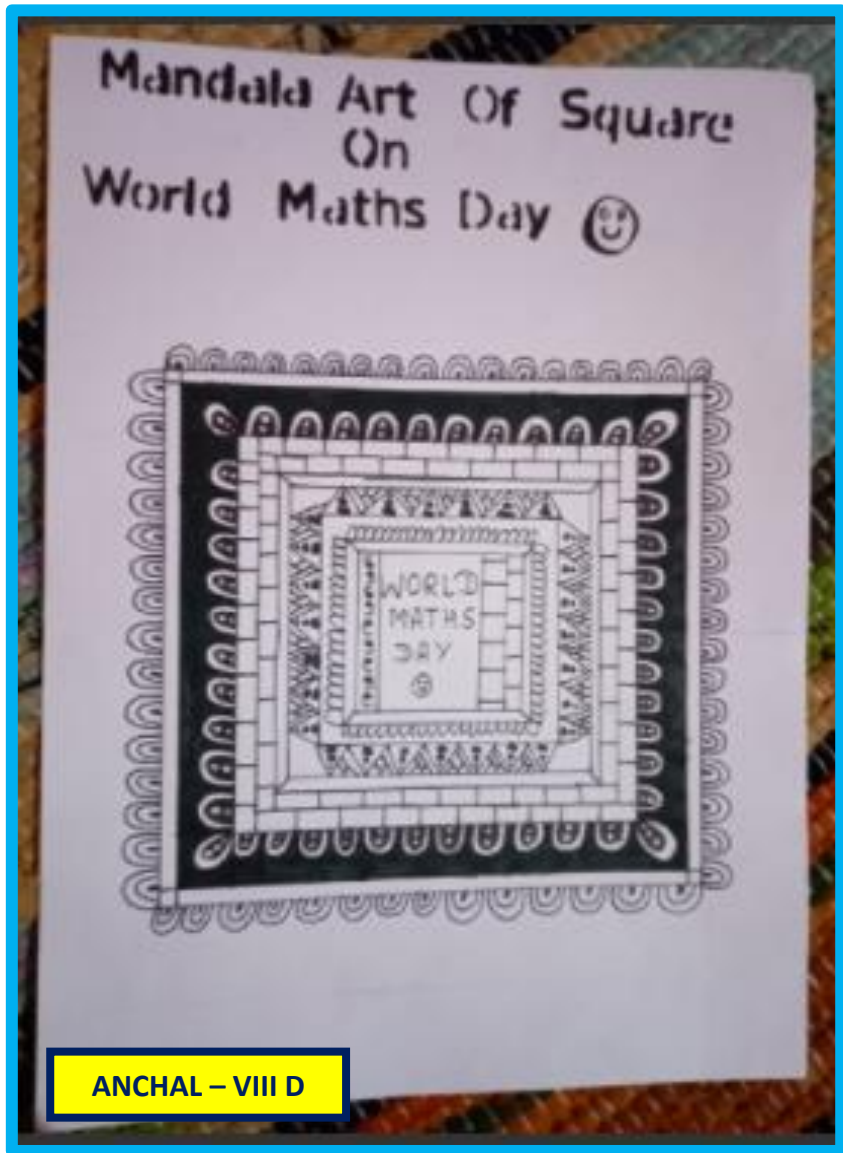

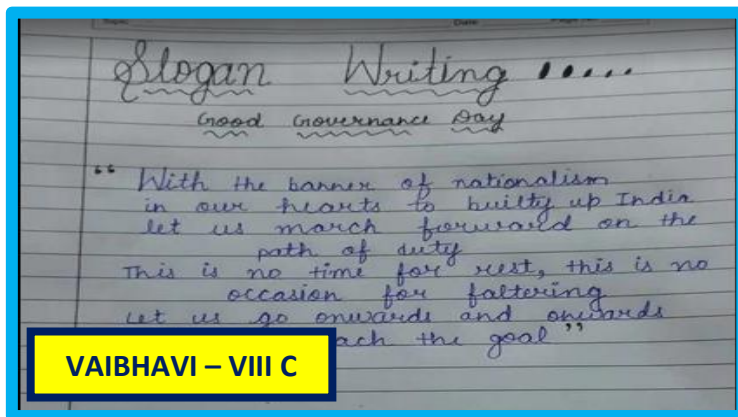


GOOD GOVERNANCE DAY – 25 DECEMBER 2021
