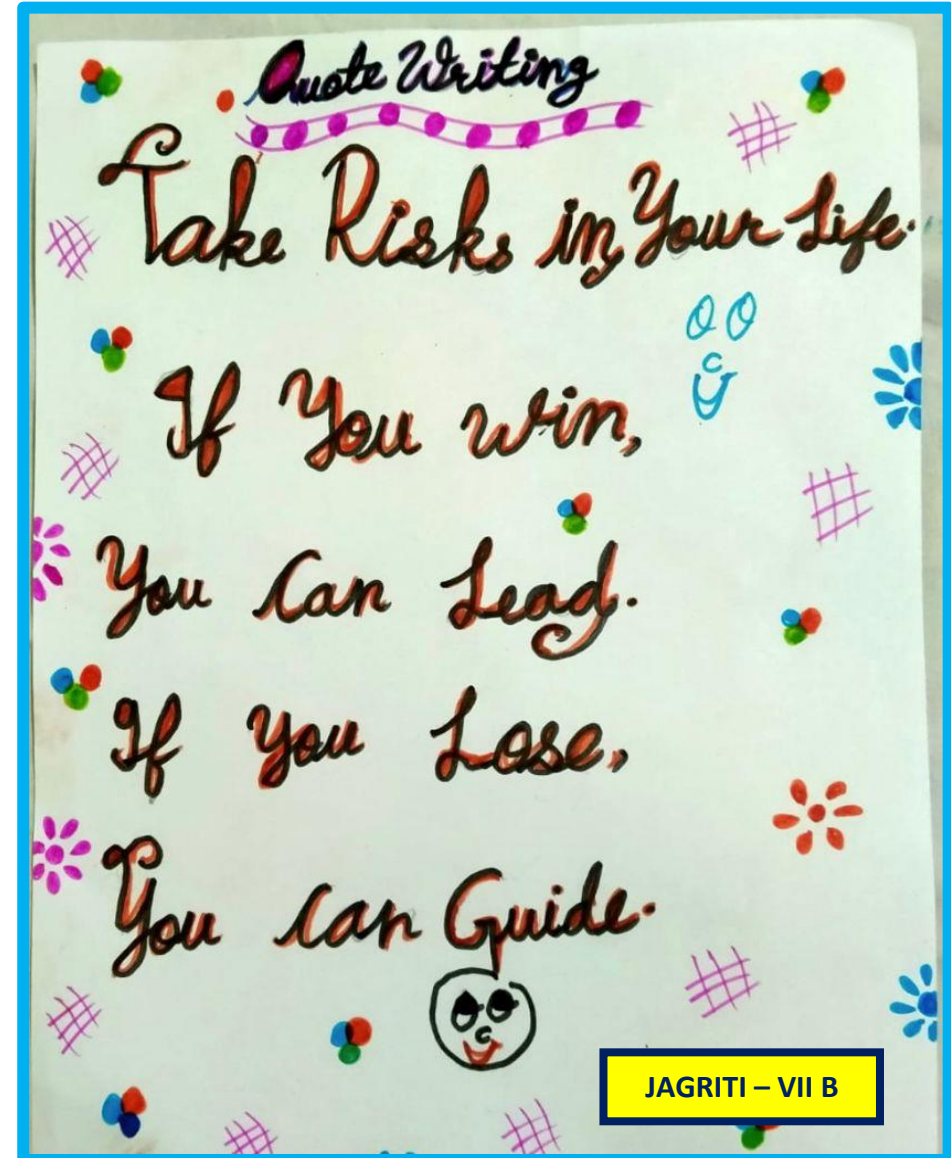

## MAKAR SANKRANTI – 14 JANUARY

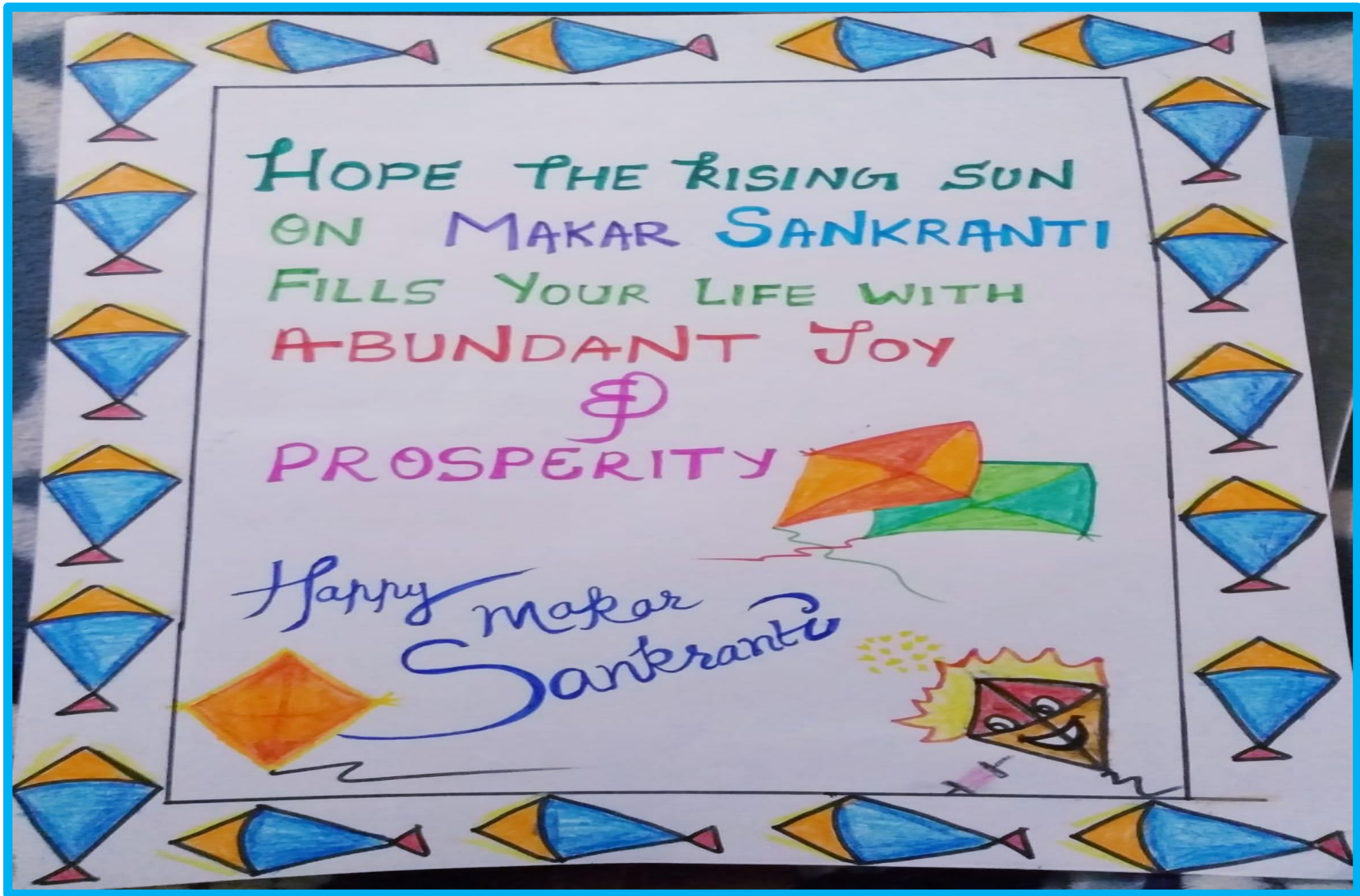

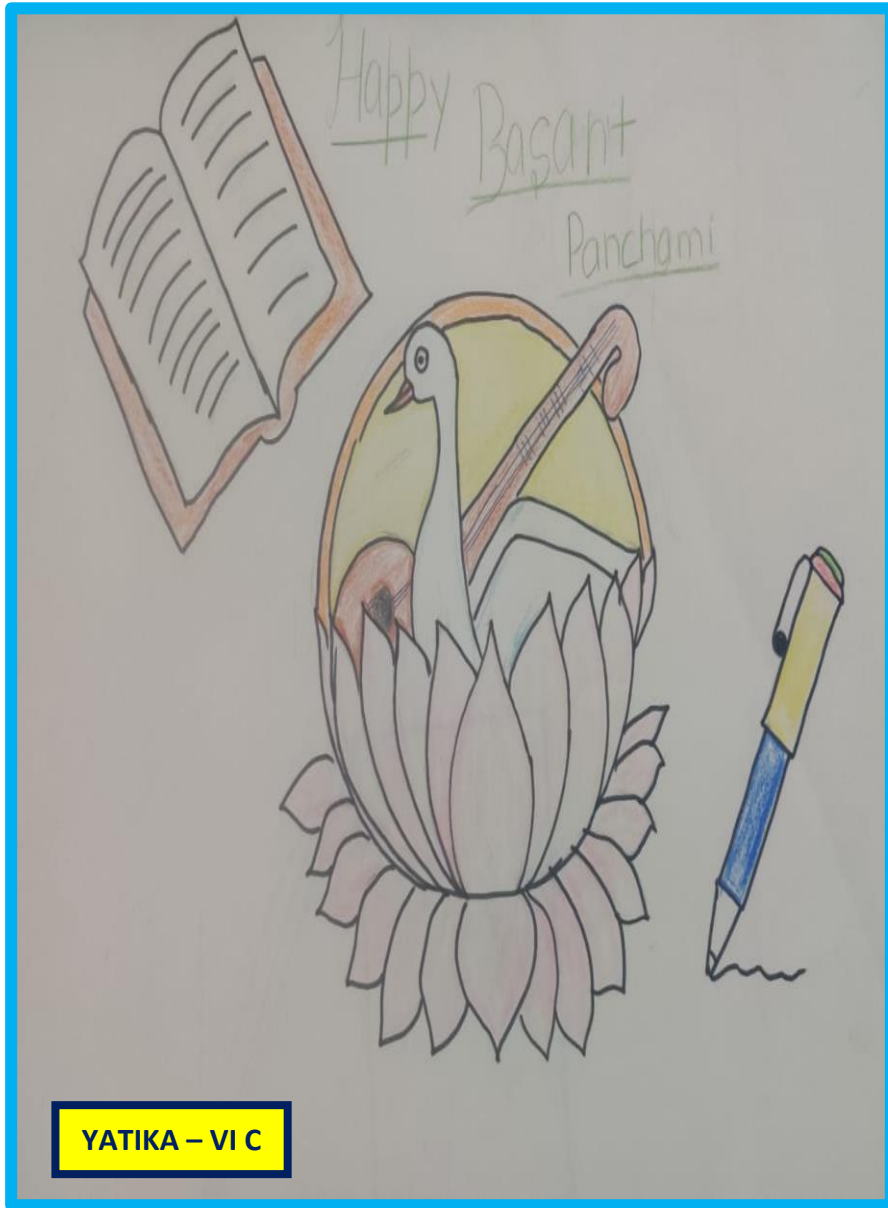


## **VASANT PANCHAMI – 5 FEBRUARY 2022**

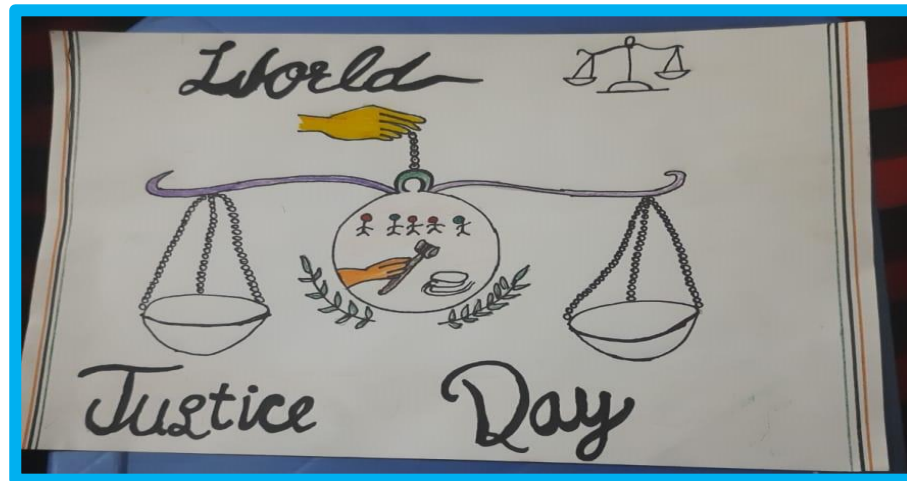


## WORLD DAY OF SOCIAL JUSTICE – 20 FEBRUARY 2022

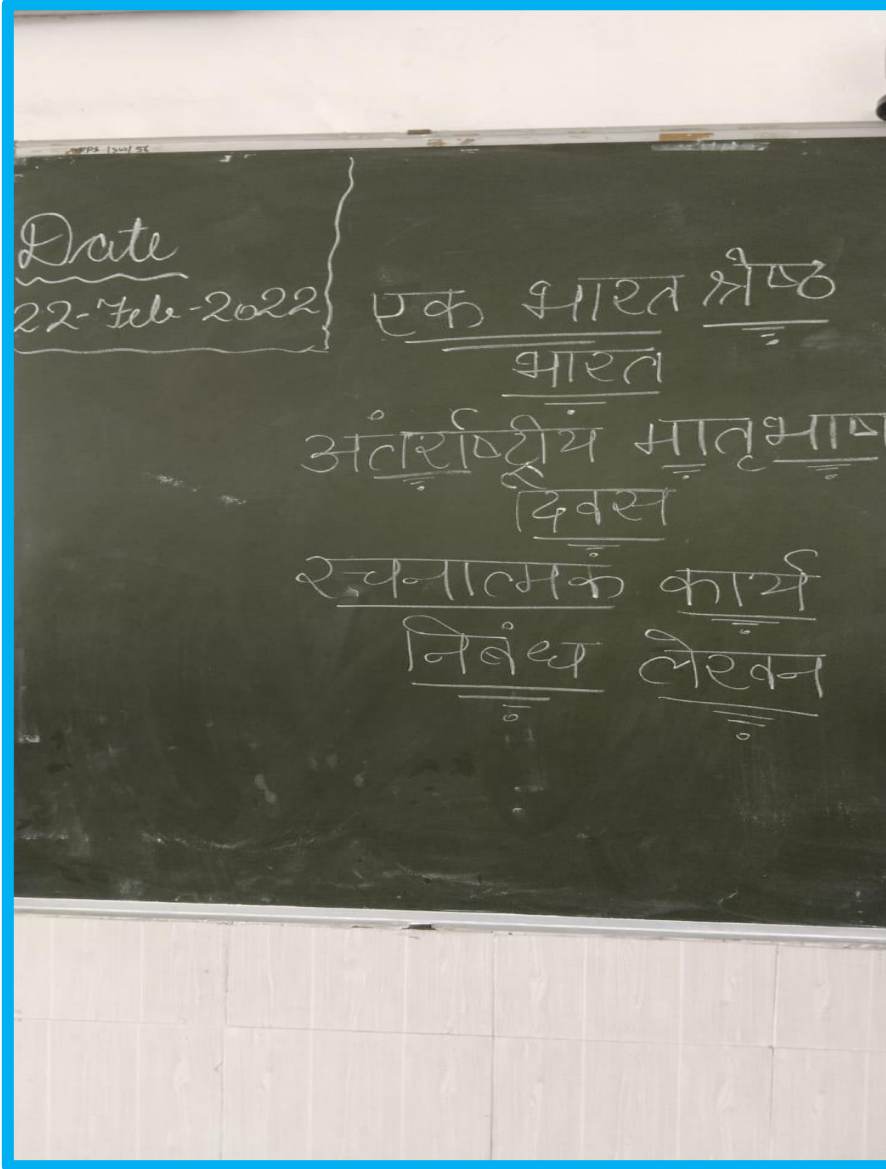

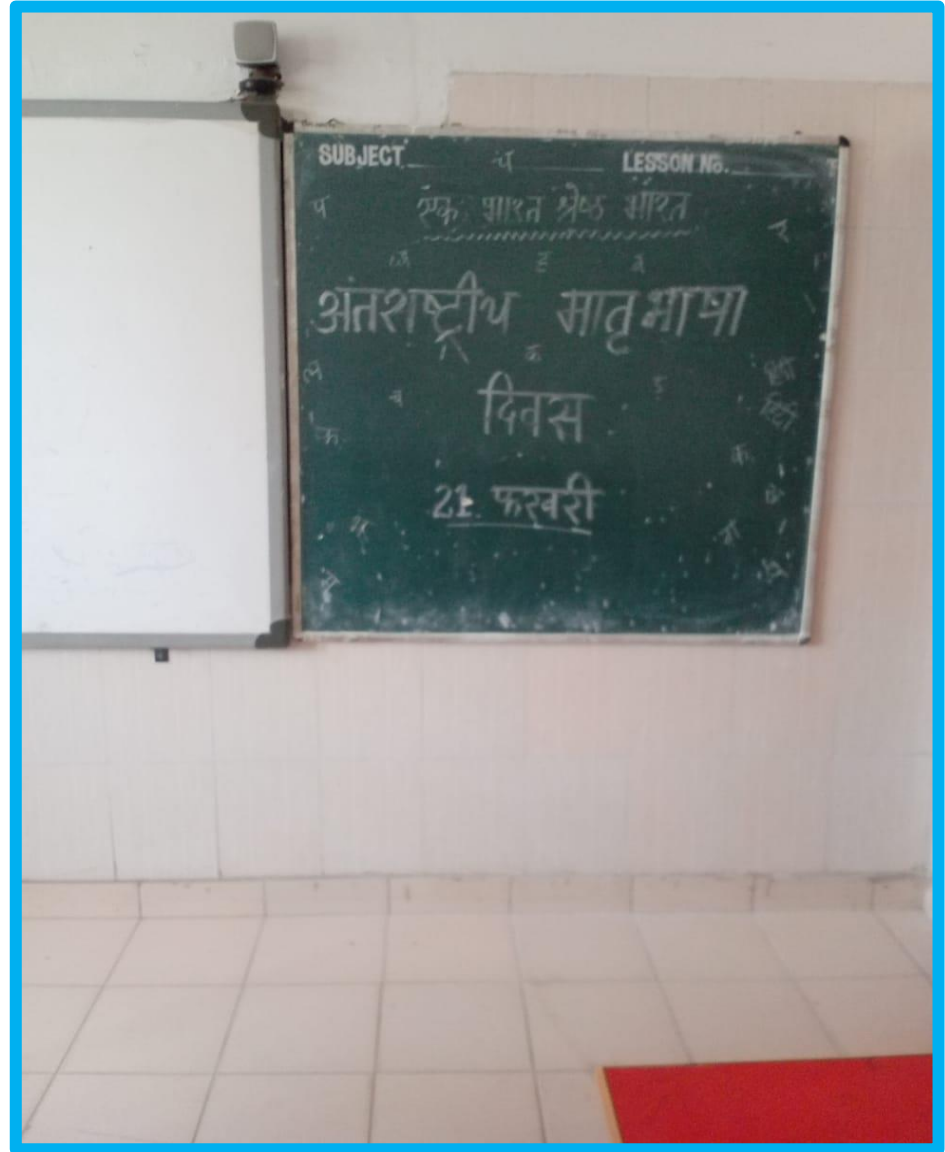

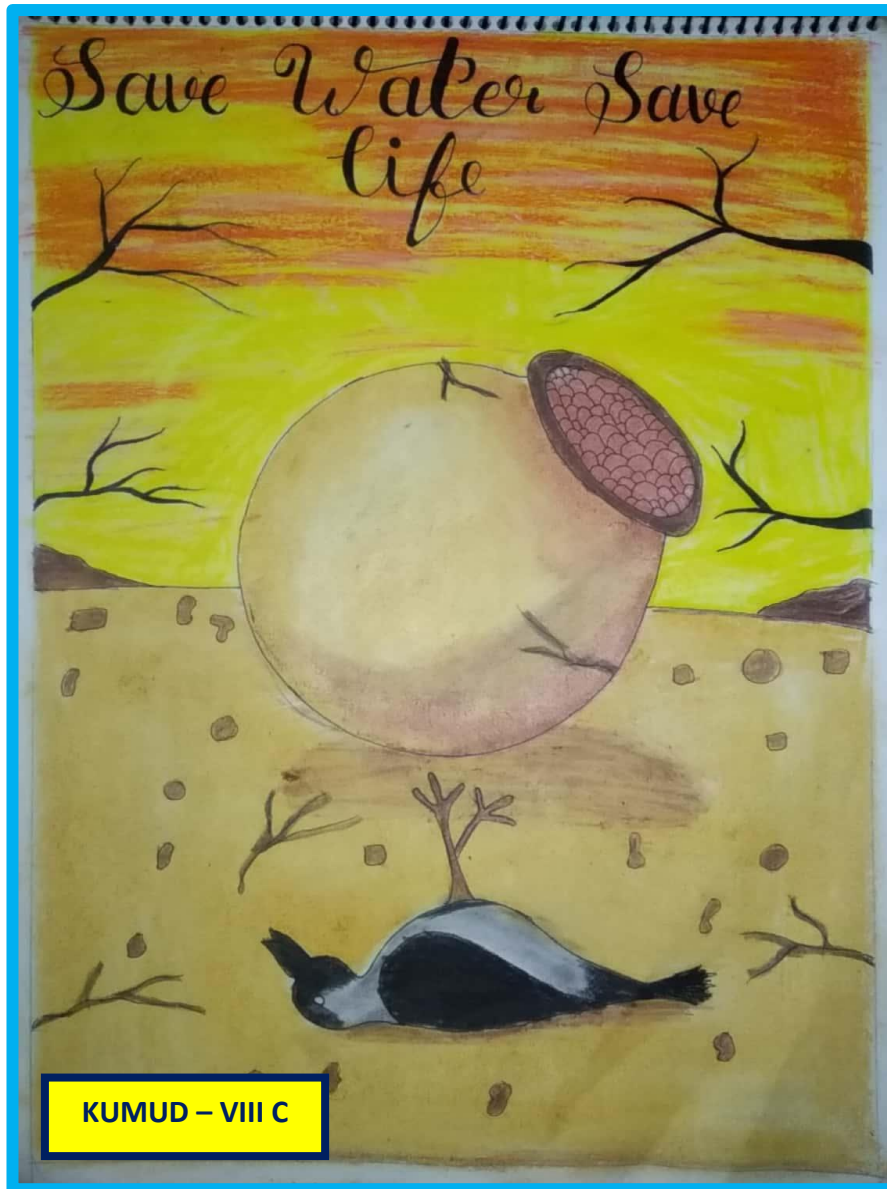
## WORLD WATER DAY – 22 MARCH 2022
